

## ASSISTED LIVING RESIDENTS

- **45%** are over the age of 85.
- **60%** have Alzheimer's disease or other form of dementia.

- **100** assisted living communities
- **1,800** beds or licensed max capacity

**>90%** of communities are **Medicaid**-certified

**40%** of residents rely on **Medicaid** for their long term care
